# Public Works Department

## The City of White House To Privatize Solid Waste Collection

The City's Board of Mayor and Aldermen (BMA) approved a solid waste collection services contract with Waste Industries, a private hauler, at the September 20, 2012 BMA meeting.

**Who will be affected by this change in collection service?** This new solid waste collection program will affect the residential, condo, multifamily and small commercial customers that are currently serviced by the City's solid waste department.

**When will this new solid waste hauler start collecting the garbage?** The City is anticipating a start date **Monday, December 3, 2012**.

**Will I receive a new container for my garbage?** You will receive a new green container only if you are using the "push cart" low profile collection container. The City's new hauler, Waste Industries, will be distributing the 95-gallon, tall, green containers to those customers during the last two weeks of November.

**Will my garbage day remain the same?** The solid waste collection schedule will be an every week pick-up schedule, which will operate Monday through Thursday. Since the new hauler, Waste Industries, has GPS routing capabilities, they will make adjustments to the current routing system. This change will be done to create more efficient collection routes. After Waste Industries develops the new routes, the City will notify those customers that will be moved to a different collection day.

Please remember that **ALL ROUTES** will be done using an **AUTOMATED** collection truck, so you need to keep the garbage container:

- Near the edge of the road, preferably on a flat surface;
- At least 3 Feet away from any obstruction, such as a tree or mailbox.

**What will happen if I overfill the container or put garbage on top of or beside the collection container?** As per the City's ordinance, "Only refuse in the container will be collected. If additional refuse is left on or around the container the City will not pick it up". The collection driver will take a picture of the container for the City, but the driver won't pick up the overflowing container. The primary reason is that the contents have a high likelihood of spilling onto the ground. As per the City's ordinance, "Extra household refuse will be picked up by appointment only and a fee will be charged".

### Clean-Up Days



Citizens are allowed to bring in two free pick up loads of household refuse to the Public Works Facility; located at 427 Industrial Drive, Monday – Thursday 7:15 am until 5:15 pm throughout the calendar year. (January 1st thru December 31<sup>st</sup>)

Photo identification and or proof of residency will be required (examples: copy of your sewer or property tax bill). This information will be logged in our billing system and attempts to use this free service more than twice during the calendar year will be denied. If the citizen wishes to utilize the service after the two free loads have been utilized, then normal charges will apply.

## "Be Prepared" - WHPD Crime Prevention Tip of the Quarter Safety in the Park and On the Greenway

If something happens and you need to dial 911, you will want to have a cell so you can call immediately. If you are going to an area where you may be alone, especially after dark, you may want to take an approved, legal, personal self defense weapon or personal alarm to protect yourself and notify others that you are in danger. A crime or an emergency can happen at anytime, so always be ready for everything. Take a few precautions in advance, remain well aware of everything that's going on around you, and have a great time at the park and on the greenway.

## Recycling is Coming Soon

The City's Board of Mayor and Aldermen approved a collection services contract with Waste Industries, a private hauler, at the September 20, 2012 board meeting. This new contract included an agreement to begin a curbside recycling collection program.

**Who can participate in this recycling program?** This new curbside recycling program will be available to the residential, condo's, multifamily and small commercial customers that are currently serviced by the City's solid waste collection service.

**When will this new recycling service start?** The City is anticipating a start date Friday December 7, 2012.

**When will I receive my new container for my recyclables?** The hauler, Waste Industries, will be distributing the 95-gallon blue containers to each customer during the last two weeks of November.

**How will this new recycling program work?** The recycling collection schedule will be every other Friday. You will need to set your new blue container out at the curb, just like you do for the garbage container.

Please remember that this is going to be an **AUTOMATED** collection truck, so you need to keep the recycling container:

- Near the edge of the road, preferably on a flat surface;
- At least 3 Feet away from any obstruction, such as a tree or mailbox.

**What materials will the new recycling program accept?**

- Newspaper (ONP – old news print)
- Cardboard (OCC – old corrugated containers)
- Junk Mail (SOP - sorted office paper – coated & uncoated)
- Magazines (Coated and uncoated)
- Paperboard (Packaging boxes used for cereal, frozen foods, medicines etc)
- Plastic Containers – (Numbers 1- 7 found on the bottom of container)
- Aluminum Containers (pie pans, frozen food pans, soda cans etc.)
- Steel Cans



**Can I put my glass bottles in the new recycling container?** NO! There is not an end-market at this time for mixed glass. Therefore, we cannot accept glass containers at this time.

### By The Numbers: Plastics and Their Uses

- **Plastic #1:** Polyethylene Terephthalate, also known as PETE or PET - Most disposable soda and water bottles are made of #1 plastic, and it's usually clear.
- **Plastic #2:** High Density Polyethylene, or HDPE - Most milk jugs, detergent bottles, juice bottles, butter tubs, and toiletries bottles are made of this. It is usually opaque.
- **Plastic #3:** Polyvinyl Chloride, or PVC - It is used to make food wrap and bottles for cooking.
- **Plastic #4:** Low Density Polyethylene (LDPE) - It is used to make some grocery bags, some food wraps, squeezable bottles, and bread bags.
- **Plastic #5:** Polypropylene - Yogurt cups and similar wide-necked containers are often made from it, as well as water bottles with a cloudy finish. You'll also find it in medicine bottles, ketchup and syrup bottles, and straws.
- **Plastic #6:** Polystyrene, or Styrofoam, from which disposable containers and packaging are made. You'll also find it in disposable plates and cups.
- **Plastic #7:** This number basically means "everything else." It's a mixed bag of plastics that are composed of plastics invented after 1987, such as modern plastics used in anything from iPods to computer cases. It also includes some baby bottles and food storage containers which resist staining.

## The City of White House has contracted with Code RED to Provide Mass Notification Services to the Community

The City of White House has contracted with Emergency Communications Network, LLC to license its Code RED high-speed notification solution. The Code RED system provides City officials the ability to quickly deliver messages to targeted areas or the entire City.

It is very important that every business and household take advantage of this new service offered to the citizens of White House. These systems are only as good as the telephone number database supporting them. If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be called. One of the reasons the Code RED system was selected is it gives individuals and businesses the ability to add their own phone numbers directly into the system's database, which is an extremely important feature.

No one should automatically assume his or her phone number is included in the system all individuals and businesses should log onto the City of White House website at <http://cityofwhitehouse.org>, and follow the link to the "Code RED Community Notification Enrollment" page. Those without Internet access may call the City of White House Fire Department (615-672-5338) Monday to Thursday 7:15am - 5:15 pm to supply their information over the phone. Required information includes first and last name, street address (physical address, no P.O. boxes), city, state, zip code, and primary phone number, additional phone numbers can be entered as well.

All businesses should register, as well as all individuals who have unlisted phone numbers, who have changed their phone number or address within the past year, and those who use a cellular phone or VoIP phone as their primary number. "Code RED allows geographically based delivery, which means street addresses are required to ensure emergency notification calls are received by the proper individuals in a given situation. The system works for cell phones too, but we need to have an associated street address to provide relevant messages.

Code RED gives those who want to be included an easy and secure method for inputting information. The data collected will only be used for emergency notification purposes. Questions should be directed to the City of White House Fire Department (615-672-5338) Monday – Thursday 7:15am-5:15 pm

**Caller ID** You will know the call is from CodeRED Weather Warning when you see the telephone number **800-566-9780**. If you would like to hear the last message delivered to your phone, simply dial the number back.

**Privacy** Your contact information will remain private and will only be used for severe weather alerts. You may also receive alerts in other areas that have CodeRED for community notification.

## Going Trick-or-Treating?

- S** Swords, knives, and similar costume accessories should be short, soft and flexible.
- A** Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
- F** Fasten reflective tape to costumes and bags to help drivers see you.
- E** Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before eating them. Limit the amount of treats you eat.
- H** Hold a flashlight while trick-or-treating to help you see and others see you.
- A** Always test make-up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent skin and eye irritation.
- L** Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible.
- L** Lower your risk for serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses.
- O** Only walk on sidewalks or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe.
- W** Wear well-fitted masks, costumes, and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips, and falls.
- E** Eat only factory-wrapped treats. Avoid eating home-made treats unless you know the cook well.
- E** Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Otherwise, stay outside.
- N** Never walk near lit candles or luminaries. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

## Operation I.D.

**What is Operation ID?** Operation IDentification is a national crime prevention project designed to protect your valuables from theft. In communities where it has been properly implemented, Operation ID has resulted in dramatic reductions in theft.

### The Operation ID program has three parts:

- **FIRST** - mark your valuables with your DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER so your property can be easily traced and identified as yours: **OK440549281**
- **SECOND** - Record existing serial numbers onto form provided.
- **THIRD** - Display a decal which tells would-be thieves that your property has been marked.

**What Makes Operation ID So Effective?** The decal informs the thief that this potential victim has security awareness and has taken precautions, thereby encouraging the thief to find an "easier" target. Marked property is difficult for a thief to dispose of or re-sell. It can be traced to the rightful owner with relative ease. And, if the thief is caught with marked property, it is solid evidence of possession of stolen goods.

**How Do I Participate?** Your DRIVER'S LICENSE NUMBER should be used as your identifying mark on the valuables which you engrave. A typical marking should look like this:  
**OK440549281**

**Note** that the standard two-letter **state abbreviation** precedes the number. The Driver's License Number should be engraved on an area that cannot be easily removed and which is NOT easily seen, preferably adjacent to the manufacturer's model or serial number.

**After marking your property**, make a **list** of your valuables and keep a copy of the list in a safe place. If you should subsequently become a burglary victim, you will be able to quickly describe the stolen property from this list. This will be of great help to police in their attempt to recover the stolen possessions.

Once the property has been marked and a list made, **display an Operation ID decal** on doors and windows which might be used for entry. By advertising your participation in Operation ID in this way, you are announcing that your valuable property has been marked and will be difficult for a thief to sell.

**DO NOT DISPLAY AN OPERATION ID DECAL

Record all serial numbers and photograph all valuables. Any valuable item without a serial number should be engraved for easy, positive identification.
