### **BEER BOARD**

The Beer Board has the power and is directed to regulate the sale, storage for sale, distribution for sale, and manufacture of beer within the City Limits of White House in accordance of Title 8, Chapter 2 of the White House City Code of Ordinances. The Beer Board consists of three members who serve a term of two years. One member shall be a member of the Board of Mayor & Aldermen. Meeting are called on as-needed basis.

### **BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS**

The Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) hears appeals, variances, special exceptions, zoning map boundaries, and zoning ordinance interpretations. The Board meets on an as-needed basis on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of the month at 7p.m. in the Billy S. Hobbs Municipal Center. The Board consists of five members serving three-year terms.

### **CEMETERY BOARD**

The Cemetery Board directs the management and control of the affairs of Hillcrest Municipal Cemetery and shall enforce the rules and regulations provided for by Chapter 3-2-301 through 3-2-308 of the White House Municipal Code. The Board consists of five members serving three year terms. Meetings are held on the first Tuesday of every third month at 9:00 am in the City's Municipal Center.

### **CONSTRUCTION BOARD OF APPEALS**

This Board hears appeals from property owners on decisions of the building official, building code variances, and interpretations. This board meets on an as-needed basis. The Board consists of five members serving five-year terms. All meetings are open to the public for comments.

### **INDUSTRIAL REVENUE BOARD**

Meetings of the Industrial Revenue Board are held on an as-needed basis. This Board is composed of seven members serving six-year terms. It is also registered as a public non-profit corporation with the State of Tennessee. According to state law, industrial development boards have the authority to finance, acquire, own, lease, or dispose of properties in order to promote and encourage economic development. (T.C.A. Title 7, Chapter 53)

### **LEISURE SERVICES BOARD**

This Board acts as a recommending body in the development of the leisure system with the City and shall be an advisory body responsible for providing guidelines and direction in meeting the cultural, artistic, athletic/fitness, historic, tourism, and natural resources of the community. The Board also advises the Parks Department in connection with the artistic and cultural development of White House and establishes goals, policies, and procedures for a recreation program. This Board has recently changed its meeting schedule to a quarterly basis. The Board consists of seven members serving three-year terms.

### **LIBRARY BOARD**

The Library Board consists of seven members appointed by the Board of Mayor and Aldermen to a three-year term. The Board shall provide, conduct, and supervise the public library and other related activities. The Library Board shall submit a budget annually to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen for approval and shall make full and complete annual reports to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen and all other reports from time to time as requested. Meetings are held on the second Thursday of every third month at 9:30 a.m. at the Library.

### **PLANNING COMMISSION**

The White House Regional Planning Commission has planning and regions outside the city limits in both Robertson and Sumner Counties. The Planning Commission meets on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of each month. These meetings are held at City Hall at 7:00 p.m. All meetings are open for public comment when Zoning Ordinance and Map changes, including rezoning requests, are being reviewed. For projects/properties inside the city limits, the Planning Commission reviews and makes recommendations for Zoning Ordinance and Zoning Map amendments, including rezoning requests, to the Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of White House. Inside the Planning Region, the commission reviews all subdivision projects. Rezoning requests inside the planning region are coordinated with both the City and the County. The Commission consists of seven members serving three-year terms.
